

## Will and inventory of John Trenholm of Great Ayton, 1694

In the name of God Amen. I John Trenholm of Great Ayton weaver within the county of Yorke, being infirm in body but of good and peurfeckt remembrance and preayesed be god for it yet considering the frailty of this life and purpose heare to settle this my estate which the Lord haith bestowed upon me and wheareby by no difference may heare after may rise as touching the same I do make and publish this to be my last will and testament revoking and void all other will and willes formerly by me maid.

First I do give my soul into the hands of God my maker and Redeemer and my body to the ground from whence it came and first my will is this , to give unto my father William Trenholm by name one shilling and my mother one shilling and my sister Kathran Thomson one shilling.

Item I give unto Mary Thomson which is my sisters daughter five pounds of lawful English money at the age of 21 years. If they should die before they should come to this age of one and twenty years it shall go to his two sisters and all the rest of my goodes and chattels as well movable and immovable I do give unto my said wife Mary Trenholm whom I do make my full and soule executor of this my last will and testament all my debts and funeral expenses discharged John Trenholm by mark and seall sealed signed and delivered in the presence of us
